Background:

The Bay Area UASI has received funding via the Regional Catastrophic Preparedness Grant Program for the past four years through a competitive application process.

Summary:

The FY19 RCPGP funded project of Life Sustaining Commodity Distribution Planning is complete. The final products and tools are available at: <u>https://www.bayareauasi.org/cpod.</u> These include downloadable, customizable planning templates to support jurisdictions in developing Commodity Points of Distribution (C-POD) site plans with associated memoranda of understanding (MOUs), writing local C-POD logistics plans, and holding C-POD site plan validation tabletop exercises (TTXs). Additional items include resource estimation calculators, guidance for developing MOUs, and materials from *C-POD Operations and Management* (including a condensed version with video) and *Disaster Logistics for Practitioners* training.

The FY20 RCPGP funded project of Regional Pandemic Preparedness is complete. The final products and tools are available at <u>https://www.bayareauasi.org/PandemicPreparednessPlanning</u>. These include a regionwide COVID-19 after action report, a regional pandemic preparedness framework, and an interactive, searchable, online pandemic crisis communications toolkit.

The FY21 RCPGP funded project of **Supply Chain Resilience** is underway. A series of nine supply chain resilience seminars engaging public and private sector agencies was conducted from fall of 2022 through spring of 2023. A Decision-Making Playbook and Supply Chain Considerations for People with Disabilities Report are being developed. These tools and regional supply chain resilience concepts will be exercised in an upcoming series of tabletop exercises. The FY22 RCPGP funded project of **Equitable Community Resilience** is underway. Each of the 14 UASI member jurisdictions are receiving technical assistance to complete a local roadmap to community resilience for an identified underserved community as well as to update or develop local plans. Additional community based trainings and exercises are planned within this project for 2024 - 2025.
