Summary

In an effort to combat targeted violence and domestic violent extremism, the UASI received a 2021 Targeted Violence and Terrorism Prevention (TVTP) grant and funded multiple projects under the UASI Domestic Violent Extremism (DVE) National Priority Area. The following is a summary of each of these efforts.

Under the 2021 TVTP grant, the Bay Area UASI was awarded funding for four projects. The following is a list of the four projects and their deliverables.</p>
